

Video Production – Found Movies

1. Collect your images
 - a. Go to the Web
 - b. Hold the mouse then move slightly
 - c. Download the image to disk (dragging will not work)
 - d. Download them into the P_ Your Last Name file. You will keep all your work and movies in here.
 - e. You will need about 40 images
 - f. The images should help illustrate your points made in your essay

2. Work with Imovie to put your images into the well in order.
 - a. Get the images in order
 - b. No sound or transitions or effects
 - c. Be sure to save often

3. Storyboard your images with your essay.
 - a. Draw images that resemble the images – break the squares into four small items.
 - b. On your essay, chunk it by indicated when you will start talking with a number in a circle and when you will stop speaking with a number in a square. You cannot record all the items in one shot.
 - c. Both the storyboard and the script notes must be done before recording.
 - d. Practice outside until you have the pieces down!

4. Record your sound
 - a. Use the USB Microphones to record
 - b. You must call for QUIET ON THE SET when you are ready to start and then CUT when you are done. Listen and be sure no one else in class is recording.
 - i. Everyone in class is going to be quiet. Record that part. Then say cut. The next person may then record.
 - ii. It is harder than you think!
 - c. Save often after each sound recording
 - d. Be sure to check the playback levels by moving the indicator and then pressing play.

5. SAVE YOUR MOVIE

6. EXPORTING
 - a. Attach to a Video Camera
 - b. Plug in the fire wire cable to the camera and to the disk
 - c. Turn the camera to VCR.
 - d. In IMOVIE go to FILE and EXPORT TO CAMERA
 - e. Leave the settings as they are.
 - f. Click on export
 - g. The computer will export the images and sound to the camera. After this step (and everyone is done), we will burn them to DVD.
 - h. When it's done, turn off the camera and gently unplug.
 - i. Return to Ms. Maye and put into the case.
